The Kennel Club Olympia ABC Agility Stakes*

2011/12 RULES

Supported by GWF Joint Aid for Dogs

This competition is a special agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of a dispute over the parentage of a dog, a decision will be left to the judge's discretion.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers and open to dogs in grades 1 to 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi-finals.

The first four previously unqualified placed dogs will be invited from each heat to compete in the semi-final which will be held at The City of Birmingham Championship Dog Show at Stoneleigh. The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Olympia. A maximum of two representatives of any one breed may be invited to the final from the semi final. This decision will be at the organisers discretion.



Skinner's Sevens Competition Rules 2012



An Agility competition for pairs of large dogs grades 3 –7 combined using a steeplechase style course. The class must be judged using current Kennel Club rules and a course laid with a baton change between handlers.

Class Title : Skinner's Sevens Steeplechase Pairs Large G3–7 Combined Special

Class Style : Spectator attractive steeplechase course with jumps and tunnels (no weaves) and MUST contain at least 1 Skinner's Spread (a rising spread set at maximum size). Course must contain maximum/minimum 17 obstacles and a hand to hand baton change behind the line. Mishandling the baton change 200 points penalty.

Entry Conditions : 2 dogs and 2 handlers enter the competition and take part as a competitive partnership. No changes are possible once entry to each heat closes or to the pairs that qualify.

Qualifiers : Each host venue provides 7 winning pairs to take to the final. 1st – 7th places. Only the first 7 pairs qualify. No reserves are needed.

Notes

- 1) Handlers can qualify any number of dogs for the final who will run in draw order.
- 2) The partnership (2 dogs and 2 handlers) qualify so should one dog or handler of the pair be unable to take part in the final the pair cannot compete.
- 3) Only pairs that qualify at each heat will be invited to the final.

With over £1000 in competition prize money each heat will offer the chance to 7 winning pairs to be invited to the Autumn 2012 final.

HEATS

A Heat will be a Combined Grades 1 & 2 Large Dogs Agility. If a heat needs to be split, prizes will be offered in each part, with the first three placed dogs in each part being invited to go forward for the Final.



- 1st Prize** – Trophy, Rosette and 1X 12kg Bag of Dog Food
- 2nd Prize** – Trophy, Rosette and 1X 4kg Bag of Dog Food
- 3rd Prize** – Trophy, Rosette and 1X 2kg Tub of Dog Food
- 4th – 10th** Rosettes (or 10% of entry whichever is greater)



Annual Agility Starters Cup
Rules & Regulations

- Eligibility for competition is under the Kennel Club classification and is open to dogs Working Grades One and Two Large Dog Agility.
- The competition must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the event.
- Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by those Rules and Regulations
- Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Final.
- Each heat is open to all competitors eligible for Grades 1 & 2 Large Dogs.
- Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are still eligible for Grades 1 & 2.
- Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Colimanor representative on the day of the show of this fact.
- The competition will consist of approx'10 heats with the first 3 placed dogs from each heat going through to the final. In the event of someone qualifying more than once for the final, the next placed eligible dog will be taken from the appropriate heat.
- Should someone be unable to attend the Final the next placed eligible Dog may be invited at the sponsor's discretion
- Surrogate Handlers will not be allowed.
- We reserve the right to publish any photos of the events, dogs & handlers in our promotional material without obligation

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SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees: Single entries : Non Members electronic entry via ISS = £2.85 per dog per class and Hard copy entries via post £2.95 per dog per class. Pairs entries Non Members electronic entry via ISS = £5.70 per pair and Hard copy entry via post £5.90 per pair. Camping at £18 for 2 the two nights (Friday and Saturday only) . WBSDS members receive discounted rates (Same rate applies for both hard and electronic entry handling) i.e. £2.30 per dog per class, £4.60 per pair and £13 for the two nights camping.
3. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer except for the Spec Large G3-7 Skinners Sevens Pairs Jumping. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
4. Entries may be made via the internet by going to www.ishowservices.com
5. The Working Belgian Shepherd Dog Society Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows
7. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsors for the show are listed on the schedule.
14. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations apply.
15. Anysize Jumping classes - jumps will be at a maximum height of 35cm for Large dogs and up to a maximum of 19cm for small and medium dogs. Please note that to enter a dog in either of the Anysize classes that dog cannot be entered into any other class.
16. The height limits for dogs are:
 - a. Large dogs – for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
 - b. Medium dogs – for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers
 - c. Small dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
18. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class (for classes entered on Saturday 28th April 2012 the date shall be 3rd April 2012, for classes entered on Sunday 29th April 2012 the date shall be 4th April 2012. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriated class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances the society will refund fees less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted to the show secretary within 1 month of the date of the show.
22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
23. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
24. Separate forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
25. Free entry passes – All competitors will be provided with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of a dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued.

26. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
27. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
28. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show Society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
29. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
30. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
31. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
32. Welfare of Dogs - An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
33. Dogs will not be received for competition after the class has been declared closed.
34. Please clean up after your dog and place in bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and will forfeit any remaining class entries.
35. No refunds due to incorrect entries, or requests for special running orders, will be entertained.
36. All competitors who enter any special classes agree to the rules as defined in the schedule by WBSDS.
37. Competitors must follow the stewards' instructions with regard to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
38. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of WBSDS.
39. Rosettes and Trophies can only be collected on the day of the show and will NOT be forwarded.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round within course time will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES – Standard and Special

In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definitions apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

GRADE 1 : For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

GRADE 2 : Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

GRADE 3 : Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.

GRADE 4 : Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

GRADE 5 : Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.

GRADE 6 : Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5 or 7.

GRADE 7 : Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

OPEN : Open to all.

A.B.C (SPECIAL CLASS) : Open to all large dogs excluding border collies, working sheepdogs and their crosses. In the event of dispute, the judge's decision will be final.

Any Size Jumping (SPECIAL CLASS) - Open to dogs NOT entered in any other class. This is intended as a non-competitive fun run for dogs and only CLEAR ROUND rosettes will be awarded, no placed rosettes or trophies. There will be no weaves, tyre or contact equipment and jumps will be at a maximum height of 35 cms for Large dogs and up to a maximum of 19cm for small and medium dogs.. The course will be very simple and flowing and will have a course time of 60 seconds. NB. Please mark on the entry form the size category of your dog in this class.

HEIGHT CLASSIFICATION OF DOGS

Small Dogs: for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers

Medium Dogs: for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers

Large Dogs: for dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers.

In case of cancellation of the show within 7 days of the show date, notification will be sent to the relevant web sites where possible and notified to the ISS Show Hotline 07532 11 11 57. It will be the competitor's responsibility to check with the Hotline and/or the Web sites, if continuation of the show is in doubt.

CAMPING:

- Available for a fixed fee of £18 for the Friday and Saturday night inclusive Camping should be booked on your entry form, please include your camping fees with your entry fees.
- The envelope containing your running orders will be your camping pass showing your permitted time of arrival. It is essential that you carry this with you as there will be security at the site entrance.
- Only campers who have paid in advance will be allowed in the camping area.
- **No camping units allowed on the showground before 3pm on Friday 27th April 2012 (unless you are a judge or a helper who is designated to help set up the showground, in which case entry is by separate agreement with the show organisers).**
- Please arrive on the Friday 27th April 2012 before 9.00pm – after which time the entry gates will be locked.
- **NOTE : The gates to the venue will be shut between 9pm and 7am each night**
- Campers must leave the site by 7.30pm on Sunday 29th April 2012.
- Please leave a minimum space of 20 feet between units and camp in the area indicated by the camping steward.
- Training equipment is not allowed in the camping areas.
- The joining of gardens is prohibited.
- No dogs to be left loose in gardens, or tethered to vehicles, whilst unattended.
- Fire extinguishers will be sited around the venue.
- All camping units are required to have a bucket of water at the front of the unit at all times.
- There are toilets and showers on site, plus an emptying point for chemical toilets.

****Belgian Shepherd FM comes to the WBSDS 2 day Open Agility Show****

This year, owing to the problematic and sometimes breezy nature of the area, the WBSDS agility show at Newbury Showground, will be utilising an FM radio public address system.

What this means:

There will still be the normal commentary box sited near the rings complete with loudspeakers on top, to cover the ring areas & presentations etc. - this will also be readily available for 'out of hours' use, should any sort of emergency arise. (hopefully not!) In this case there will also be one extra system to cover the extended competition area. The rest of the area, including the campsites, will be covered by an FM radio signal, which will simultaneously broadcast the same announcements, presentations etc. already going out over the main p.a. system.

Some of the Benefits

No longer will there be any complaints from local residents, because of sound 'overspill'. Neither will the p.a. be too loud or too quiet, because of changes in the wind direction/strength, or your proximity to a loudspeaker group. The way in which you hear the p.a. system will be in your control.

What you need:

The f.m. signal can be received on any fm. radio - the ones which you will normally use for radio1, radio2, & local radio stations etc. i.e. car radio, caravan radio or portable etc..

However, a personal radio (walkman type) or mobile phone with a radio can be really useful, as this (should you wish) enable you to keep up to date as to what is happening 'ringside' - even though you may be exercising your dogs or taking a stroll away from the site. The radio signal should be receivable over several miles.

Radios with a digital display - NOT to be confused with DAB (Digital AudioBroadcast) - tend to be better, as they do not drift off frequency, as do some of the 'analogue' sets. Having said that, - I've not heard of anyone having problems with the analogue sets.

You will NOT receive the signal on a 'DAB ONLY' set.

The standard FM broadcast frequency spectrum runs from 87.5MHz through to 108Mhz, with the frequency of 87.7Mhz being usually issued by Ofcom for this sort of event, although this will be confirmed at a later date. Therefore, if you intend to use an 'analogue' tuner type radio, you will probably find that your tuner is only marked down to 88MHz. - fear not! - your tuner will almost certainly go down lower - Ofcom is hardly likely to issue a frequency that is not receivable.

During the 'gaps' between announcements, presentations etc., it is intended to re-broadcast a local radio station at low level, so you can be confident that your radio hasn't gone on the 'blink'.



All members of the WBSDS are invited to take part in a competition at the WBSDS open agility show on the 28th & 29th April 2012 to find the best Belgian Shepherd Dog owned by WBSDS members in each Grade.

Competition Rules:

You must be a current member of the WBSDS to take part in this special section of the show.

The competition is open to all varieties of Belgian Shepherd Dog (Groenendael, Tervueren, Malinois & Laekenois) across both days of the show entered in the Large ABC classes.

There will be a trophy for the BEST BSD in each Grade. The winner will be determined by the best combined performances from both the ABC classes on the Saturday and the ABC class on the Sunday. To decide the best BSD on the Saturday – for Grades 1 to 4 the results will be taken from class 13, and for Grades 5 to 7 the results will be taken from Class 14. On the Sunday the Best BSD results will come from Class number 52. Points will be awarded for placings and for unplaced clear rounds, as follows: 1st place-45 points, 2nd-40 points, 3rd-35 points, 4th-30 points, 5th-25 points, 6th-21 points, 7th-19 points, 8th-17 points, 9th-15 points, 10th-13 points, 11th-11 points, 12th-10 points down to 20th-2 points and all unplaced clear rounds get 1 point. The winner will be the BSD with the highest number of points over their two runs. The score from both rounds count, but if someone has entered only one day, their total score is taken as a total for both days and there is no need to enter on both days to be considered for this competition. In the event of a “tie break” situation, the handler with the highest points in the agility round will take priority.
